Admission Information: All students must meet the regular admission requirements as stated in the Holmes Community College Bulletin. **Prior to registration date**, be sure to submit an online *Application for Admission* at www.holmescc.edu, ACT scores, GED or high school transcript (for freshmen students), or college transcripts (for transfer students). Fees and Expenses Information: Full-time tuition (12 or more hours) is \$825 per semester. Part-time tuition (less than 12 hours) is \$85 per credit hour. In addition to the tuition, a \$12 per hour fee (capped at 15 hours for a maximum of \$180, non-refundable) is charged per semester. (Example: The fee for ENG 1113 is \$255 + \$36 = \$291. The fee for ENG 1113 and MAT 1313 is \$255 + \$255 + \$72 = \$582.) On-line courses have an additional fee of \$10 per credit hour. All fees (subject to change) are payable at registration and are listed in the Holmes Community College Bulletin. Financial Aid Information: To apply for a Pell Grant to pay for tuition and books, submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students can apply at any time during the school year, but it must be done **at least six weeks prior to the start of the semester** in order to receive a book voucher. Students may apply for FAFSA, MTAG, the Sumner Grant, and the Work Study Program by logging onto www.holmescc.edu, clicking on “*Financial Aid*”, and following the appropriate links. ACT scholarships are automatically awarded when a student submits a composite score of at least a 20 to Holmes Community College and registers for at least 15 hours.
