# HOLMES APPOINTS 9TH PRESIDENT Dr. Jim Haffey

On Sept. 10, 2014, the Board of Trustees named Dr. Jim Haffey the 9th president of Holmes Community College. Dr. Haffey came to Holmes 11 years ago, starting out as a workforce development coordinator and WIA director. Since that time, the 37-year-old Ebenezer native has served as director of financial aid and vice president of the Grenada Center.

Upon graduating from Holmes in 1997, Dr. Haffey earned three degrees from Mississippi State University, including a bachelor's and master's in business administration and a PhD in community college leadership. Prior to coming to Holmes, he worked as a lobbyist for the Mississippi Manufacturers Association dealing with tax and environmental issues.

In 2014, Dr. Haffey received the Grenada Chamber of Commerce Special Recognition Award. He is an active member of the community, as well as an avid golfer and outdoorsman. Dr. Haffey and his wife Rae Anne have two children; Hayley, 11, and Hudson, 9, and they are members of First Baptist Church of Kosciusko.

"I can't imagine a better job in the world," Dr. Haffey said. "We have to have a servant's heart for our students. No matter where they go or what career path they choose, I want them to look back at Holmes and say this is a place that cared for them."























#### Holmes says farewell to President Dr. Glenn Boyce

Dr. Glenn Boyce came to Holmes Community College as the vice president for community and workforce development and served as interim president before becoming the 8th president of the college on March 23, 2006. Under his leadership, Holmes reached the highest enrollment in school history and was recognized nationally as one of the nation's highest achieving community colleges by the Aspen Institute. Since Dr. Boyce became president, Holmes has also achieved a record number of graduates and was one of the leading institutions in the community college system in the percentage of increased graduates for several year. The college has significantly expanded teaching locations and opened numerous new academic and career/technical programs in its service area.

In July 2014, Holmes said goodbye to Dr. Boyce when he took a position as Associate Commissioner for Academic Affairs at the Institution of Higher Learning (IHL) in Jackson.

"It would have taken an opportunity of this stature to move me away from Holmes," Dr. Boyce said. "This is a special place with outstanding people who truly care about students first."


During the time period between Dr. Boyce's departure and Dr. Jim Haffey's hire, Dr. David Cole, former president of Itawamba Community College, served as interim.







# Holmes enters agreement with Blue Mountain College



On Nov. 3, 2014, Holmes Community College entered into an articulation agreement with Blue Mountain College that ensures a seamless transition to Blue Mountain College for Holmes CC graduates. Specifically, this agreement ensured that 62 hours earned at Holmes will place Holmes student as juniors at Blue Mountain. This agreement made the fifth articulation agreement between Blue Mountain and Mississippi's community colleges, and was finalized by Holmes CC President Dr. Jim Haffey, Holmes CC Vice President for Academic Programs Dr. Fran Cox, and Blue Mountain President Dr. Barbara Childers McMillin.



### Coulter Named Humanities Teacher of the Year

Prentiss native and Ridgeland Campus English Instructor and Writing Center Director Stacey Coulter was named 2014 Humanities Teacher of the year for Holmes Community College.

As part of her award, Coulter presented "You Can't Go Home Again: Women's Agency in the Novels of Kamala Markandaya" on Nov. 4 in the McGowan Center on the Ridgeland Campus. Her presentation, which was adapted from a chapter of her dissertation, explored Markandaya's seventh novel, "Two Virgins," in which she tells the story of a female character attempting to live outside the traditional boundaries of behavior for a young woman in 1960's India. Starting with "Two Virgins," Markandaya began to find potentially long-term avenues for women's empowerment in unexpected places.

Coulter received her B.A. in English from Mississippi College and a M.A. in English from Wake Forest University, where her master's thesis focused on the poetry of W. B. Yeats. She has also completed coursework for her PhD in English at Claremont Graduate University in Claremont, Cal. She plans to complete her dissertation and graduate in spring 2015. Prior to her employment at Holmes, Coulter taught English courses at Davidson Community College, University of LaVerne, Copiah Lincoln Community College, and Mississippi College. She has been a faculty member at Holmes since 2006.

Coulter's determination to be an English major came the summer after her freshman year of college when she read Anne Moody's memoir, "Coming of Age in Mississippi." She said that she admired Moody's tenacity and commitment to civil rights and knew that she wanted to commit her education to studying literature. In graduate school, Coulter's major area of study was twentieth century British literature with a particular interest in post-colonial and feminist theory. During her time at Holmes, she has taught developmental English courses, English Composition I and II, and British Literature.

"I enjoy the challenge of teaching writing classes, as I look for new ways to engage the students in the process of improving their writing and research skills," Coulter said. "I also value my position at the writing center, where I have the opportunity to train student tutors and work with student writers in a one-on-one setting."

When Coulter is not teaching, tutoring, or writing, she enjoys hanging out at her home in Fondren with her husband, Reuben, their son, Jackson, and their three dogs.

Coulter was recognized in February by the Mississippi Humanities Council at the 2015 Public Humanities Awards Reception at the Jackson Marriott Hotel.

















# Michelle Burney Named New VP of Grenada Center

In October of 2014, lifelong Grenada resident Michelle Burney was promoted from academic counselor to vice president of the Grenada Center, a position previously held by Dr. Jim Haffey. Prior to becoming an academic counselor at Holmes in 2004, Burney served as an outreach coordinator for St. Dominic Behavioral Health Services in Grenada beginning in 1999. From 1996-1999, she served as counseling center director at Charter Behavioral Health Systems in Grenada, and from 1998-2000, she was an instructor in psychology/educational psychology. She also taught elementary and middle school in the Jackson Public School District and the Grenada School District from 1992-1996.

Burney earned her bachelor's degree from Millsaps College and her master's from Mississippi College. She has additional studies from the University of Mississippi and Delta State University, as well.




## **Dedications**Grenada Library Named for Jack L. Holmes


Jack L. Holmes has never been a man of few words, but when Holmes Community College placed his name on the library of the Grenada Center on Oct. 10, 2014, his emotions showed through when he talked about his love for Holmes and the city of Grenada. Holmes has served the college for over 42 years. His tenure began in 1971 as the supervisor for the Kosciusko Skill Center before becoming the vocational-technical assistant director. In 1985, Holmes became the first vice president of the Grenada Center.

Holmes has been valuable in the Grenada community, from overseeing the enlargement of the physical plant to growing relationships with many businesses and partnerships in and around the city. He retired from the Grenada Center in 2010 and was then named the director of annual giving by the Foundation later that year.

During the dedication ceremony, district librarian Joan Tierce said, "We are extremely happy to have our library named after Mr. Holmes. He's a favorite and a special person to us. This is a building of dreams because it's a building of knowledge and knowledge allows all of us to dream."












## Ridgeland Student Union Named for Joe A. Adams



## Ridgeland Campus Adds New Programs

#### **Surgical Tech Program**

The Holmes Community College Ridgeland Campus added a Surgical Technology program beginning in the fall of 2014. Taught by Jackson native Travia "Shea" Coleman, the program includes classroom lectures and clinical labs in anatomy and physiology, aseptic technique, medical terminology, microbiology, operative procedures, patient care, pharmacology, medical/legal aspects, and technological sciences.

Surgical techs work with surgeons, anesthesiologists, registered nurses, and other surgical personnel in delivering patient care and assuming appropriate responsibilities before, during and after surgery. The goal of the Surgical Tech Program at Holmes is to prepare students for employment as competent, knowledgeable surgical technologists who will become valuable contributing members of the health care team.





### Concrete Mixer/ Truck Program

The Holmes Community College Ridgeland Campus Workforce Development Department added the Professional Concrete Mixer Truck Driving Program in the summer of 2014. The 8-week program teaches basic customer service skills, quality assurance, proper safety technique, knowledge in the basics of concrete, and driving a commercial vehicle. Upon completion, drivers can be placed in any ready mix business across the state of Mississippi or the southeast United States.


























## SkillsUSA brings in the awards at state competition








"Mississippi Mayhem" Ole Miss and Mississippi State pull off historic seasons.

### 2014 Distinguished Alumni



Alumna of the Year Trina D. George



Distinguished Service Award Dr. Samuel O. Massey, Jr.

The 2014 Alumna of the Year, Trina George, (class of '93), is the Mississippi State Director for USDA Rural Development.

George was appointed to her position by President Barack Obama and the Obama Administration in June 2009. She has made history by being the first woman appointed to this position for the state. An important advocate for rural communities throughout the state, she is responsible for assisting residents in rural areas with 40 programs designed to improve the economic stability of rural communities, businesses, residents, farmers, and ranchers.

Prior to her appointment, George served as Special Project Coordinator for Congressman Bennie Thompson in the House Committee on Homeland Security District Office for 15 years.

At Holmes George was an honor student and a member of Student Government Association. Today she is involved in numerous civic organizations and in 2014, received the National Unsung Hero Award. She has also been named to Mississippi Business Journal's 50 Leading Business Women, named Parent of the Year by the Grenada School District, and given the 2012 Delta Regional Authority's Delta Distinguished Award.

George has three children; a son, Stephen, and twins Sterlin and Shaunna.

The 2014 Distinguished Service Award recipient, Samuel Massey, Jr., (class of '53), is an ENT-otolaryngologist, medical missionary, and retired colonel of the U.S. Air Force.

Upon graduating high school, Dr. Massey entered the enlisted ranks. One month later, he became a charter member of the U.S. Air Force. He served two tours - in the Panama Canal Zone and in Puerto Rico during the Korean War - before enrolling at Holmes Junior College.

After graduating from Holmes, Dr. Massey obtained his medical degree from University of Tennessee College of Medicine. After 12 years of working in medicine in Picayune, he went to Tulane Medical School to specialize in otolaryngology.

Dr. Massey's accomplishments include: opening his own practice, promotion to colonel in the Tennessee Air National Guard, being named Chief of Surgery at Eglin Air Force Base, being named Chairman of the Department of Otolaryngology for Wilford Hall Medical Center, receiving The Excaliber Award, receiving the Air Force's Outstanding Clinical Surgeon Award, and receiving the National Humanitarian Award. He and his wife, Jamie, have six children and 11 grandchildren.







































### HOLMES STUDENTS GIVE TO THEIR COMMUNITIES
























### BULLDOGS HOPE TO BUILD ON 2014 SUCCESS

Despite a 4-5 record, the Holmes Community College BullIdogs finished in the Top 10 in rushing offense, pass defense, and total defense in the country.

"I'm proud of the way our guys fought game in and game out," Holmes CC Head Coach Jeff Koonz said. "We made some changes coming into the season regarding the scheme especially on the offensive side of the ball. We came up a game short, but we did show improvement over last year, which I'm proud of."

Offensively, the Bulldogs switched to flex bone when Offensive Coordinator Tim Stowers came on board in the spring. Holmes finished fifth in the country in rushing with 273.2 yards per game.

"For the first year we are really pleased," Koonz said. "It did accomplish what we were hoping for. Those numbers are on the low end of what he expected. We expect to be 300 plus per game, but we plan to stick with it. Now we can use it to recruit and bring in some really good players."

Six members of the Bulldog football team were invited to participate in the MACJC All-Star game at Northeast Mississippi Community College. Those players included Antreon Bennett, Jamario Benson, Mitchell Cunningham, David Hendershot, De'MonTerius Kendrick, and Ryhean McMorris. Head Coach Jeff Koonz served as the head coach of the North Division.

Bennett tied for the team lead in tackles with 51. He had two sacks and six tackles for loss. Benson had 474 yards on 153 carries with three touchdowns while Cunningham led the Bulldogs with 679 rushing yards on 112 carries with seven touchdowns. Hendershot was the Bulldog center in 2014. Kendrick was credited with 10 tackles with one tackle for loss for five yards. He also had 12 kickoff returns for 305 yards and one touchdown from 86 yards out while McMorris finished up the season with 37 tackles with one tackle for loss, two interceptions, and three passes broken up.

The Holmes Community College Lady Bulldog soccer team ended the 2014 season with a 7-7-2 overall record and 2-5-1 record in the North Division.


Nalls and LShonda Wilson of Indianola were

been a wonderful season and a wonderful ride. They've been working for me all year. They've been working for Coach Harrison all year. We'll build on this and get ready for next year."




Three members of the Bulldogs basketball team received honors from the MACJC and the NJCAA Region XXIII.


Freshman pitcher/infielder Blair Little was named to the 2014-2015 NJCAA Division II Softball Top Incoming Freshman List.
